Professional Development Programme

The Professional Development (PD) Programme is a structured training programme designed to enhance teachers' skills, knowledge, and teaching methodologies. These sessions focus on Skill Enhancement, Collaborative Learning, Practical Implementation, and Policy & Trends. The session was conducted for five days with different topics.

Day: 1

Day 1 of the professional development session began with an inspiring address from our Head of School, who introduced the new academic year and emphasized the institution's vision for educational excellence and holistic development. The opening session concluded with a call to collaborative action, urging faculty members to work together as a cohesive team in pursuit of the school's mission to nurture well-rounded, future-ready individuals. This motivational address effectively set the tone for the academic year, aligning all teaching staff with institutional goals while recognizing their vital role in shaping young minds.

Following this, Ms. Mujeeba, an expert in educational reforms and pedagogy, led a session focused on the













National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The aim was to familiarize educators with the key aspects of the policy, its implications for teaching practices, and strategies for effective implementation in schools and higher education institutions. Ms. Mujeeba began by outlining the vision of the NEP, highlighting its focus on holistic and multidisciplinary education, flexibility in learning, early childhood care and education (ECCE), multilingualism, and technology integration.

To further enrich the day, a professional development session themed "Understanding and Working with Higher Order Thinking Skills: Strengthening Assessment and Evaluation Practices" was conducted by Mr. Senthil, the Cambridge Coordinator. This workshop focused on enhancing teachers' understanding of Bloom's Taxonomy and the significance of Higher Order Thinking Skills (HOTS) in classroom teaching. Educators were guided in designing lessons and assessments that promote critical thinking, problem-

solving, and creativity components of 21st-century learning. The session also highlighted the principles of Competency-Based Assessment and how they can be effectively integrated into daily teaching and evaluation practices. The training was interactive and insightful, equipping teachers with practical strategies to elevate their instructional methods and empower students to become independent, analytical thinkers.

Day: 2

Day 2 of the professional development session focused on "Promoting Mental Health Among Teachers," conducted by Ms. Sasikala, the Middle School Coordinator. The session aimed to address the growing concerns regarding teacher well-being, stress management, and strategies for maintaining mental health in a demanding profession. The discussion included common stressors in the teaching profession, such as heavy workloads and administrative pressures, balancing personal and professional emotional exhaustion from student behavioral issues, and lack of recognition and support. Ms. Sasikala emphasized that mental health is just as important as physical health and encouraged teachers to acknowledge their struggles without stigma.







The day continued with a vibrant "Meet and Greet" session organized by Ms. Saranya and Ms. Padma Priya. This event welcomed and introduced the newly joined teachers from various domains. Designed to foster team bonding, ease transitions, and create a positive work culture, the event featured fun-filled interactive activities. The mix of laughter, storytelling, and teamwork set a positive tone for collaboration in the new academic year

Day: 3

Day 3 focused on "Ethics & Integrity Among Teachers," led by Ms. Merline, the Pre-Primary Coordinator. This session highlighted the importance of upholding professional standards in education. It underscored the role of teachers in shaping students' minds and characters, as well as the necessity of having a code of professional ethics. Key points included the significance of maintaining confidentiality and trust in teacher-student relationships, the need for impartiality and fairness in teaching practices, and the role of teachers as role models for both students and the community.

The session continued with insights on "Inculcating Life Skills Among Students," presented by Ms. Asha and Ms. Nazira. It began with an engaging activity that aligned with the school's motto of "learning through activity." The facilitators emphasized the integration of life skills into the curriculum, particularly focusing on problem-solving and critical thinking. Teachers identified essential life skills for students based on their age and developmental stages, highlighting the importance of these skills in students' overall development. The session provided practical insights on how to incorporate life skills into teaching practices and offered guidance on ensuring a cohesive learning experience. Overall, the session was informative, engaging, and relevant, equipping teachers with valuable strategies to support students' development of life skills.

Day: 4

Day 4 featured a collaborative session on "Experiential Learning and Active Learning Strategies," by Ms. Sathya Priya which was conducted for teachers and proved to be highly engaging and impactful. The session began with an interactive icebreaker, followed by a presentation that highlighted key concepts such as Kolb's Experiential Learning Cycle and various active learning methods, including think-pair-share, role-plays, and reflection journals. Teachers participated in hands-on group activities where they designed mini-lessons incorporating these strategies, followed by peer sharing and discussions.

Next, an interactive professional development session on "Al and Technology Integration in Classroom Teaching" was led by Ms. Suganya and Ms. Saranya. This session focused on innovative ways to leverage artificial intelligence and digital tools to enhance pedagogy. It blended theory, live demonstrations, and hands-on activities to empower educators with 21st-century teaching strategies. The topics included introducing Al-powered educational tools for personalized learning, demonstrating practical applications of technology in lesson delivery, and addressing challenges and ethical considerations related to Al in education.

The final session of the day featured a dynamic professional development discussion on "Collaboration Among Teachers in Building a High-Performing School," conducted by Mr. Boopathy, Exams Officer, Cambridge. This session emphasized the importance of teamwork, a shared vision, and collective responsibility in enhancing school performance. It highlighted the role of teacher collaboration in school success, explored strategies for effective teamwork among educators, and discussed practical approaches for fostering a collaborative school culture.

International Yoga Day

On June 20, 2025, International Yoga Day was celebrated with great enthusiasm by the students and teachers at our school. Students from grades 3 and 7 demonstrated various yoga asanas taught by our Physical Education teachers. SUNITA WILLIAMS

Sunita Williams is an American astronaut and a retired U.S. Navy officer who has set impressive records during her three missions to the International Space Station (ISS). She was selected as a NASA astronaut in 1998. Sunita served aboard the ISS, becoming the first woman to participate in a flight test of an orbital spacecraft.

A Long Time in Space

Astronauts Sunita Williams and Butch Wilmore spent an additional 278 days in space after their week-long mission in June turned into a nine-month journey. They successfully returned from this extended mission, landing in the Gulf of Mexico.

Two Notable Achievements of Sunita Williams

Sunita has set records for the most spacewalks by a woman (seven) and for the longest total

time spent on spacewalks by a woman (50 hours and 40 minutes). She is one of the most experienced spacewalkers, having completed nine spacewalks, totalling 62 hours and 6 minutes outside her spacecraft. Sunita currently holds the record for the longest total spacewalk time by a woman.

Humility, Gratitude, and Faith Despite her remarkable achievements, which are hard to match, Sunita always emphasizes the importance of gratitude and staying grounded. NASA astronauts Butch Wilmore and Indian-American Sunita Williams returned to Earth after completing a mission that lasted more than nine months. Throughout her career, Sunita has received numerous awards, and her groundbreaking accomplishments in space exploration have made her a role model for future generations of space explorers. She has shown great courage during her spacewalks, spending over 50 hours outside her spacecraft. This demonstrates her physical and mental stamina—qualities essential for success in challenging situations. Sunita often shares her experiences with children, encouraging them, "If you want something but receive something else, do not give up!" As a source of inspiration, Sunita Williams urges young people to "Dream big, work hard, and never stop believing in yourself." She advises them to try new things and emphasizes that failure is merely a stepping stone to success.


