First be the best, then be first

Prioritising personal mastery and deep learning over grades and status

Focus on becoming truly excellent in your field rather than getting caught up in the race for grades or status. When you prioritise mastery, achieving the "top spot" becomes a natural outcome rather than a forced goal.

Be the best

Instead of worrying about how you rank compared to others, concentrate on mastering your craft and developing good habits.

Study to understand, not just to pass

Excellence comes from a passion for learning and the ability to apply knowledge to real-world problems, rather than from rote memorisation for exams. Build a solid foundation by focusing on essential skills like time management, active listening, and consistent daily practice. High performers often spend up to 70% of their time practising and refining their skills instead of merely consuming new information. Additionally, develop "human skills" such as critical thinking, communication, and emotional intelligence, which are highly valued by employers and remain relevant long after specific academic content is forgotten.

Be First

Once you have established a foundation of excellence, leverage that strength to lead and stand out. Use competition as a catalyst for growth, pushing your own boundaries instead of simply trying to

defeat others. Participate in student competitions, internships, and research projects to test your ideas and showcase your developed skills to top employers.

Avoid being distracted by every new opportunity. Choose a specialised area where you can excel and focus deeply on that until you reach the top 1%. Surround yourself with motivated, high-achieving individuals; as the saying goes, you are the average of the people you spend the most time with. Don't chase the medal; chase the skill that earns the medal. If you are a student, what is one specific skill you feel you need to master before you can confidently claim the "top spot" in your field?

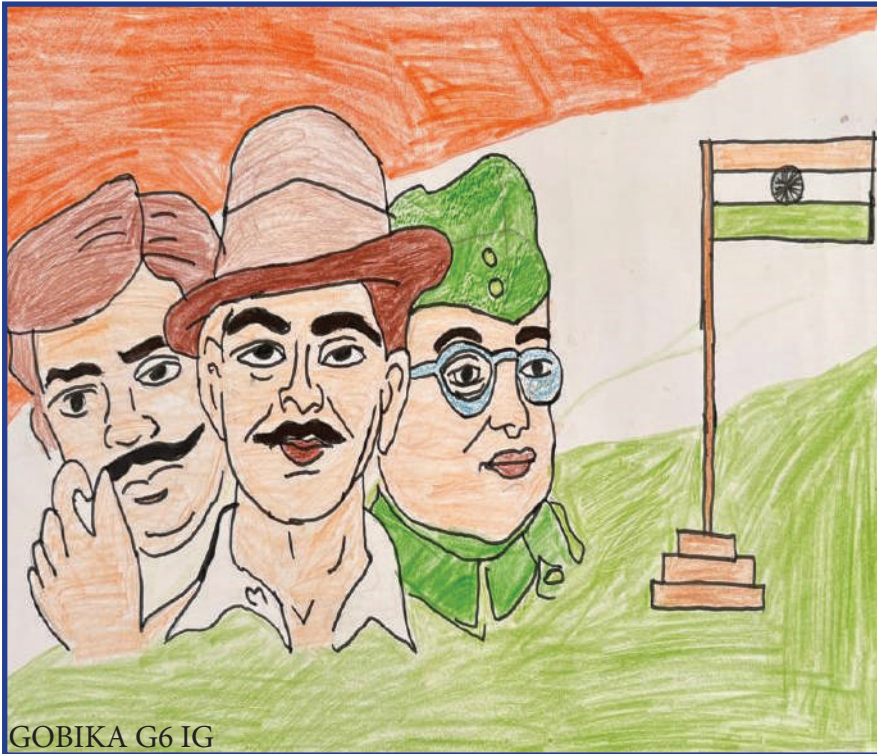

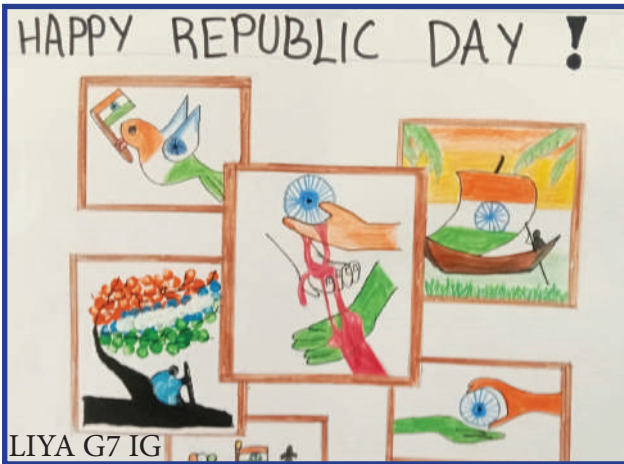

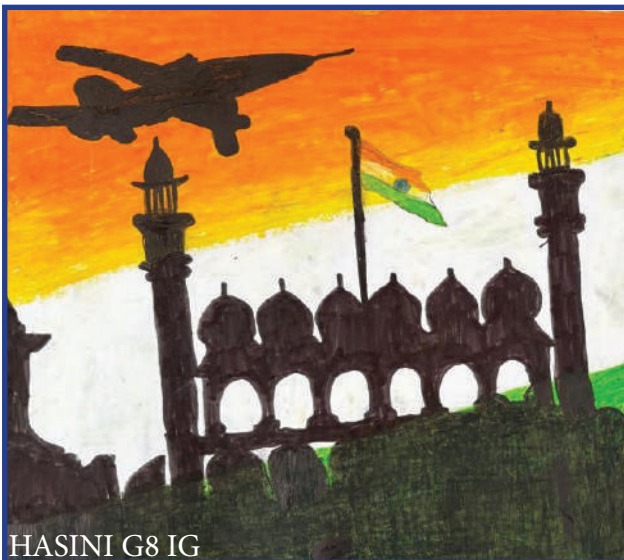
