








Students will be recognised and appreciated for their efforts with certificates awarded in three categories: Skill, Teamwork, and Effort.













#### Mid year PTM

The Parent–Teacher Meeting (PTM-3) for Grades 1 to 5 was conducted on 22 November 2025. The session proceeded smoothly and witnessed an encouraging level of participation from parents. The meeting aimed to review the overall progress of students based on the Mid-Year Examination (Term 1) and to strengthen home–school collaboration for further academic and behavioural development.

#### **Academic Performance Review**

Teachers discussed each student's performance in the Term 1 assessments, covering all curricular subjects.

- Teachers highlighted areas where individual students need further improvement and guided parents on supporting learning at home.

To help students perform their best, they were strategically assigned to three examination rooms, and teachers provided additional remedial classes to support their preparation for each exam. As the examination period comes to a close, both students and educators are eagerly awaiting the results, which will reflect the hard work and commitment demonstrated by the students, as well as the tireless efforts of the teaching faculty in pursuit of academic excellence.

#### PTM

A Parent-Teacher Meeting (PTM) was conducted on 22.11.25 (Saturday) to discuss the midyear examination results and gather feedback from parents. The meeting saw a good turnout, with most parents attending to review their child's performance. Parents were satisfied with their child's progress and sought insights into areas where their child could improve. The meeting focused on identifying areas where teachers can improve and implement changes to enhance student development. Discussions centered around student growth and strategies for further improvement. The PTM was productive, and feedback will be used to implement positive changes.

#### SAFAL KSA Assessment

The SAFAL Key Stage Assessment was successfully conducted for Grade 9 students from November 10 to 17, and for Grade 6 students from November 24 to December 1. This competency-based assessment aims to evaluate students' understanding and application of concepts, shifting the focus from rote learning to critical thinking. The SAFAL exam plays a crucial role in identifying areas where students

need improvement, allowing for targeted interventions and support. By emphasising competency-based assessment, SAFAL encourages students to develop a deeper understanding of their subjects, leading to a more holistic learning experience. The insights gained from this exam will help educators refine their teaching methods, ultimately benefiting students' academic growth and development.



### Secondary Pre Board Examination 1

Students in Grades 10 and 12 who are appearing for the Board Examination in the academic year 2025-2026 have been provided with an extensive revision programme designed to revise, reinforce, and assess their understanding of key concepts. This revision occurs before the Pre-Board Examination, allowing students to prepare thoroughly on a chapter-by-chapter basis. They gain exposure to the Board Pattern question papers, engage with concept-based questions, and enhance their confidence through practice papers and effective time management. The Pre-Board Examination 1 is scheduled from November 17 to November 28, 2025

#### Half Yearly Examination

The Half-Yearly Examination for Grades 9 and 11 is scheduled from November 24 to December 8, 2025. This examination will include both theory and practical papers in all subjects. Students will receive hands-on experience in lab activities, programming, language skills, and mathematical skills. Each subject will undergo thorough revision, with practice based on Board Pattern question papers.

#### Two Level Board Examination

On November 20, 2025, the CBSE organised a webinar on the Two-Level Board Examination for students, parents, and teachers of Grade 10. The event was inaugurated by Mr. Rahul Singh, the CBSE Chairperson. The webinar provided valuable information regarding the exam's eligibility criteria, syllabus, assessment schedule, internal marks, declaration of results for both exams, admissions into Grade XI, stream selection, exam preparation, registration process, and various other topics. The session was interactive, and Mr. Sanyam Bhardwaj, the Controller of Examinations, addressed queries from students, teachers, and parents. Additionally, a set of FAQs related to the examination was released to clarify the concept of the Two-Level Board Examination.





#### TVSSC Award Ceremony

The TVSSC Award Ceremony for the academic session 2025-2026 was held in Vellore on November 22, 2025. This ceremony aims to recognise the hard work and dedication of students and teachers for their success in the Board Examination. Toppers from both Grades 10 and 12 will be invited and honoured for achieving the highest marks in the Board Examination. Krishna Darshan from Grade 10 and Harshavardhani from Grade 12 received special prizes on this occasion. The GeeKay World School was honoured with certificates and mementoes for achieving 100% results in the X & XII Board examinations. Mr. Piyush Sharma, Regional Director, CBSE, presented the awards.

#### Webinar on Mental Well-Being

On November 19, 2025, the CBSE organised a webinar titled "Psychological First Aid: A Multidimensional Framework for Promoting Mental Well-Being in Educational Settings." This webinar aimed to equip teachers, counsellors, and school leaders with essential psychological skills to effectively address distress, anxiety, and behavioural challenges among students. Our secondary teachers attended the webinar.

The session, led by Prof. (Dr.) Daya Pant, Former Head of NCERT, emphasized a structured approach using the LOOK–LISTEN–LINK framework that enables educators to recognize, assess, and respond effectively to students in distress. The webinar also explored real-life case studies demonstrating how to manage crises like panic, aggression, or disobedience with calmness and empathy.

#### PTM

The Parent Teacher Meeting (PTM) for Grades 9 to 12 was held on November 7th and 8th, 2025. During the meeting, we discussed the Periodic Assessment Performance for Grades 9 and 11, as well as the Revision Examinations for Grades 10 and 12. Grade 10 parents also had a separate meeting on November 8, 2025, where they received an overview of all assessments conducted and the Pre-Board Examinations planned to prepare students for the Board Examination patterns, timetable, and available resources.

Ms. Mujeeba, the Academic Coordinator, provided a briefing on Board Preparation and the extensive revision planning carried out in the school. She emphasised the role of parents in creating a healthy environment at home and discussed the subjects offered at the school, as well as various streams and career options.

Ms Sasikala, the Middle School Coordinator, engaged parents in a discussion about. She elaborated on the Vedantu NEET and IITJEE Integrated Classroom courses available at the school. The Vedantu faculty members took turns updating parents on the teaching and learning system, highlighting the integration of technology into the learning process through various Apps to prepare students for competitive exams and more.

### Cambridge

#### Leadership Forum on Cambridge Advanced

The Leadership Forum on Cambridge Advanced, featuring Ms. Abigail Barnett, was held at Hotel Radisson Blu, Chennai, on 7th November 2025. The forum was attended by Mr. Senthil Kumar, Coordinator-Cambridge, and Mr. Boopathy, Cambridge Exams Officer.

The session focused on understanding the concept of transition, particularly the progression from IGCSE to A Level, and the various forms of support available to schools and learners. 
